### The Magic In-Between

Relational poverty. Isolation. Lack of social capital. Disconnection from community.

These phrases, which come with other associated states such as loneliness, despair, overwhelmed, and stuck, describe the problem that Partners in Hope (PIH) seeks to address.

But exactly how do we address this growing epidemic? We first start with prayer, with the end goal of connecting the Partner Families we work with to the Body of Christ through ongoing, client-focused Relational Ministry.

What happens between those two steps? That's where the magic happens! Consider these ministry activities that occur in a typical month here at PIH:

A Community Workday and a Pre-Workday in each service area to address deteriorating living conditions; Fellowship Dinners hosted by churches; Coffee Connection devotional gatherings for both men and women; home visits to our contract families to assess needs and outline goals; meals delivered by caring volunteers; connections to community resources such as employment services, healthcare, and counseling/life coaching; and Relational Ministry Trainings to equip volunteers and churches.

All these activities are infused with our Core Values of Christ-Centered Compassion, Connection, Community, and Commitment. With lots of meaningful conversations and laughter sprinkled in as well!

And it's not just our families who benefit from these activities. Our volunteers are involved in serving opportunities that help them better understand Jesus' command to love our neighbors. Our Partner Churches are given the chance to do outreach beyond their walls to share the Good News of God's grace and forgiveness. And other ministries and businesses also join us in these efforts.

We are immensely grateful to YOU, our donors, for your investment in people who are often overlooked or ignored. God's Kingdom is alive and well, and we are honored to partner with you in this beloved ministry.

#### **YOUR 2024 IMPACT IN STORIES**

### **Extra-Mile Connections Bring Smiles to Single Moms**

PIH is all about creating partnerships that pour hope into our communities, so last summer we teamed up with Methodist Healthcare Ministries, Lake Travis United Methodist Church, and one of our PIH Coffee Connection groups to develop relationships with single moms in the Lake Travis area.

Grants from Methodist Healthcare Ministries and the Verb Foundation totaling \$5,000 were used to identify single moms in the area who could use connection and hope, a challenge many of our families face as well. Volunteers for this project, many of whom are current or past PIH clients, put together gift baskets that included food gift cards, Bibles, first aid supplies, tool kits, and other essentials as a way of showing support to these lovely moms and their families.

And to top it off, Lake Travis UMC hosted a fellowship celebration, filling the room with encouragement and love to ensure that each mother left feeling uplifted and cherished. They also visited the Austin Trail of Lights together in December!

We are grateful to all these moms for letting us into their lives, and for all the volunteers who worked to make this initiative successful!

#### **Connections to Community Resources Help Reduce Social Isolation**

Our two Community Resource Assistance Day (CRAD) events in the summer of 2024 were a great success! This is just one of the ways PIH helps our neighbors get connected to valuable resources. Examples of nonprofit and government organizations that provided help included healthcare, housing, senior services, and job seeker groups.

In Lake Travis, we had 15 agencies represented with 17 individuals receiving assistance, along with 15 volunteers. Attendees received giveaways, which made it a fun event, while families also had a chance to have quality time with each agency.

In Cedar Park, 11 agencies helped the 9 families who came to the event, and 8 volunteers welcomed our guests and helped with door prizes and snacks.

We plan to grow these offerings next year, so let us know if you are aware of a community organization we should invite to share about their resources!


